Bible Sunday / Proper 25



Isaiah speaks to Israel struggling in exile, revealing that God is the one true Lord over all nations. This is a reminder that wherever and whatever is going on in the world, God is somehow in charge, and that one day “every knee shall bow to him”. Question: do I have confidence that God is in charge.

Paul urges a divided church in Rome, through the encouragement of the scriptures, to live in harmony, to build up their neighbours and in one voice glorify God. How is Scripture encouraging us to relate better to others?

Jesus begins his ministry with his ‘Nazareth Manifesto’ from Isaiah, saying “Today this Scripture has been fulfilled”. In Jesus, the Living Word, the promises of God become reality: good news, freedom, and healing. Am I stepping into the promises of God today? Is this scripture real for my life?

FIRST READING Isaiah 45:22-end

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah.

Thus says the LORD: Turn to me
and be saved, all the ends of the
earth! For I am God, and there is
no other. By myself I have sworn,
from my mouth has gone forth in
righteousness a word that shall not
return: "To me every knee shall
bow, every tongue shall swear."
Only in the LORD, it shall be said
of me, are righteousness and
strength; all who were incensed
against him shall come to him and
be ashamed. In the LORD all the
offspring of Israel shall triumph
and glory.

PSALM Psalm 119:129-136

R *The opening of your word
gives light.*

Your testimonies are wonderful;
therefore my soul keeps them.
The opening of your word gives
light;
it gives understanding to the
simple. **R**

I open my mouth and draw in my
breath,
as I long for your commandments.
Turn to me and be gracious to me,

as is your way with those who love
your name. **R**

Order my steps by your word,
and let no wickedness have
dominion over me.

Redeem me from earthly
oppressors
so that I may keep your
commandments. **R**

Show the light of your
countenance upon your servant
and teach me your statutes.
My eyes run down with streams of
water,
because the wicked do not keep
your law. **R**

SECOND READING

Romans 15:1-6

*A reading from the letter of Paul
to the Romans.*

We who are strong ought to put
up with the failings of the weak,
and not to please ourselves.
Each of us must please our
neighbour for the good purpose
of building up the neighbour.
For Christ did not please himself;
but, as it is written, "The insults
of those who insult you have
fallen on me." For whatever
was written in former days was
written for our instruction, so
that by steadfastness and by the
encouragement of the scriptures
we might have hope. May the
God of steadfastness and
encouragement grant you to live
in harmony with one another, in
accordance with Christ Jesus, so
that together you may with one
voice glorify the God and Father
of our Lord Jesus Christ.

GOSPEL Luke 4:16-24

*Hear the gospel of our Lord Jesus
Christ according to Luke.*

When Jesus came to Nazareth,
where he had been brought up,
he went to the synagogue on the

sabbath day, as was his custom.
He stood up to read, and the
scroll of the prophet Isaiah was
given to him. He unrolled the
scroll and found the place where
it was written: "The Spirit of the
Lord is upon me, because he
has anointed me to bring good
news to the poor. He has sent
me to proclaim release to the
captives and recovery of sight to
the blind, to let the oppressed
go free, to proclaim the year of
the Lord's favour." And he rolled
up the scroll, gave it back to the
attendant, and sat down. The eyes
of all in the synagogue were fixed
on him. Then he began to say to
them, "Today this scripture has
been fulfilled in your hearing."
All spoke well of him and were
amazed at the gracious words that
came from his mouth. They said,
"Is not this Joseph's son?" He
said to them, "Doubtless you will
quote to me this proverb, 'Doctor,
cure yourself!' And you will say,
'Do here also in your home town
the things that we have heard you
did at Capernaum.'" And he said,
"Truly I tell you, no prophet is
accepted in the prophet's home
town."
