A VIEW FROM THE VICARAGE



Dear Saints,

Luke 6: 38: "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For with the measure you use, it will be measured to you."

I love the wonder of Christmas. It's a magical time of year for children and adults, and also quite an expensive one, especially as one's children get older. It's never a good time to talk about money and giving, but needs must.

Giving is part of Christian discipleship, and it frees us from the hold money has over us. When we give, we give not only for the upkeep and running of the church, but we also give to God. Wesley humorously once said the last part of a person to be converted was their wallet! God sees what we give, and appreciates it "give and it will be given to you.." Why does All Saints need more money? Mostly because of increased costs. The increase

Why does All Saints need more money? Mostly because of increased costs. The increase in utility, cleaning and gardening costs alone next year will be around £10,000. We currently also need to replace our heating system (around £30k) and upgrade our electrics (£9k), there is all our regular outgoings, and ongoing maintenance that have also increased. At the same time, inflation has also reduced the value of what we current give; what cost £100 today only cost £20 back in 1980.

So how much should we give? How much is our worship worth to you? These days even a trip to the cinema, a drink and popcorn will cost over £20. Only an extra £10 a week from everyone would cover our extra costs for next year. All over the world the church has traditionally taught tithing, that is giving 10% of our income to the church. Personally, I direct debit 10% of my stipend every month to All Saints. It feels good and right to do that, investing in our worship, and honouring to my Lord. I would encourage you to do the same. Perhaps if that is too much, how about 5%? I think you will find it liberating, and find that God will honour it, and somehow there is always enough at the end of the month. Bank details are in our weekly bulletin. (And please don't forget to fill in a giftaid form, so we can claim an extra 20% from the government!) Think of it as giving a present to Jesus this Christmas.

Mmmm Cake

This was a very popular recipe that went around in the 1980s.

A budget-friendly Christmas cake, easy and ideal if you are on your own or to share with someone special.



Ingredients

8 oz. self-raising flour

4 oz. margarine

4 oz. brown sugar

1 egg

8 oz. mincemeat 1 & half dessert spoon marmalade

2 oz. glacé cherries, sliced

2 teaspoons sherry

Method

Cream margarine and sugar until light and fluffy.

Add marmalade and beat again.

Beat egg and add to creamed mixture.



Fold in flour.

Add mincemeat, sliced cherries and sherry.

Turn into a well-greased tin, (8" or 2 smaller tins.)

Gas mark 3 for 1 & half hrs.

Five Popular Classic Story Ballets - part 1 -



The American dancer and choreographer, Agnes de Mille, once said,

"The truest expression of a people is in its dance and in its music. Bodies never lie."

Ballet has the power to evoke strong emotions through its storytelling, choreography, music, and performances.

A Classic Story Ballet, also known as Story Ballet or Narrative Ballet, refers to ballets that follow a storyline. These are the bread and butter of any ballet repertoire, and they are firm favourites for good reason. They are often based on fairytales and magical myths, featuring recognizable characters and full set designs and costumes, which make them eye-catching and easy to follow.

From *Swan Lake* to *The Nutcracker*, here are some of the greatest Classical Story Ballets ever conceived.

Swan Lake

Tchaikovsky's 1875 work remains one of the most popular ballets ever written and contains the famous pieces 'Dance of the Little Swans' and the instantly recognisable Act I Waltz.



The curtain first opened on *Swan Lake* in 1877 at Moscow's Bolshoi Theatre, with choreography by Julius Reisinger; however, the most influential version was choreographed by Marius Petipa.

The ballet, inspired by Russian and German folk tales, tells the story of the doomed love of Prince Siegfried and Princess Odette.

<u>Interesting fact</u>: As well as the famous cygnets' dance, *Swan Lake* also includes some of ballet's most famous moments, including '*The Black Swan Pas de Deux*' and '*The Dying Swan*'.

Sleeping Beauty

The first performance of Tchaikovsky's now iconic ballet took place in the Mariinsky Theatre, St Petersburg in 1890, choreographed by Marius Petipa.

Telling the traditional fairytale of a princess cursed to sleep for 100 years awaiting true love's first kiss, *Sleeping Beauty* remains one of Tchaikovsky's most popular works today. It is also his longest ballet, totalling nearly four hours (including intermissions). As a result, the ballet is almost always cut.

The ravishing waltz is one of the most joyous and uplifting pieces of classical music, as well as one of the best known. It comes towards the beginning of the ballet, during a grand ball thrown for the 16th birthday of the protagonist, Princess Aurora.

<u>Interesting fact</u>: The ballet is said to have been the first ever seen by an eight-year-old Anna Pavlova, who would become one of the world's greatest ballerinas of all time.






Book review: Over My Dead Body

If you like your murder mysteries served with a dose of British dark humour, then this book is for you.



Dr Miriam Price is dead, and everyone thinks it was an accident. But this alpha female isn't taking her death lying down and she sets out to find out who killed her.

This is a different take on the whodunnit with the initially unlikeable victim – if you can ever call Miriam Price a victim – also acting as the detective who tries to solve her own murder.

The problem is the only person who can see Miriam and she can communicate with is scheduled to die at the weekend and it's her neighbour Winnie. The other complicating factor is that Miriam has been at war with pensioner Winnie for several years, since Miriam accused her of running over her beloved cat.

Fortunately though, Winnie's dead husband was a detective and her nephew a serving police officer so Winnie turns out to be a pretty handy, if acerbic, sidekick to Miriam.

But Miriam is up against the clock. She has only four days to solve her murder before the coroner rules it death by misadventure and she destined for a life in between.

This is a very funny book if you like dry, British humour, the characters grow on you and the plot cracks along at a good pace. It's a fun book to switch off with at the end of a busy day or on the train home.

Change to winter garden waste collections

Data gathered during the past three years has shown a distinct drop off in the tonnage of garden waste collected during the winter months, by on average, more than 50 per cent.

To reflect the reduced need, the council is moving from weekly to fortnightly free garden waste collections from December to February, which will also reduce its carbon footprint with fewer vehicle journeys and emissions on our roads, and ensure the service remains efficient and cost-effective.

There won't be a change to residents' collection days, just the frequency, and you will still be able to look up your collection schedule online or report missed collections.

Residents with large amounts of garden waste will still be able to drop off unlimited garden waste, for free, at our civic amenity sites in New Years Green Lane, Harefield and Tavistock Road, West Drayton. Find out more at www.hillingdon. gov.uk/waste-and-recycling-centres.




