#### A VIEW FROM THE VICARAGE

**Dear Saints** 

Moving from Casual to Meaningful Conversations This Christmas

As we catch up with friends, family, and colleagues this Christmas, how can we gently move from casual chat to deeper, more meaningful spiritual conversations?

#### 1) Start With Genuine Interest

Have no agenda except getting to know the person and showing love. The FROG questions can help begin relaxed conversations:

- Friends & Family: Tell me about your family... what's home like?
- Recreation: What do you do for fun?
- Occupation: What kind of work do you do? Do you enjoy it?
- Goals & Gifts: What are you passionate about? What are your hopes right now?

#### 2) Let Curiosity Deepen the Conversation

Meaningful conversations grow out of relationships and good listening. Become an intentional question-asker. People open up about their passions and pains when they feel safe. Gentle follow-up questions such as:

- What makes you passionate about ...?
- Do you ever feel like there's more to life than work and money?
- What are you worried about in the world / your life?

#### 3) Inviting God Into the Conversation

Spiritual conversations flow naturally from meaningful ones. Look for simple moments to connect the discussion with faith:

- Are you a spiritual person?
- Did you grow up with any experience of church or faith?
- Do you ever pray?
- Has God ever felt close in a difficult time?

If appropriate, most people welcome prayer; simply offer it if it feels right. You may also (practice in advance) sharing a short "15-second story" of how God has helped you at some moment in your life.

#### 4) An Invitation to Explore

If someone shows interest, you might gently ask them if they want to come to a service, or just our mid-week coffee morning. The aim is simply to love people well, notice where God may already be at work, and be ready, when the moment is right, to share the hope we have.



May we all deepen our relationships this Christmas.



#### Meeting the Pop Singer Joe Brown



In the November 2025 edition of 'Saint's Alive' I alluded to a story of having met the famous Pop Singer Joe Brown (of Joe Brown and the Bruvvers fame) on the footplate of the steam locomotive at the Late Sir William McAlpine's private railway museum at Fawley near Henley-on-Thames.

Having left this story as a bit of a cliffhanger I figured that I really needed to explain more!

Sir William started his private museum and steam railway on his 250-acre estate in the mid 1960's when his family firm of civil engineering contractors 'Sir Robert McAlpine Ltd.' was about to get rid of their last steam locomotive. Apparently, he asked the yard foreman how much it would fetch for scrap and when told it would raise about £100, he got out his cheque book and wrote a cheque for that amount and told the foreman to send it to his home. Having acquired the locomotive, Sir William then set about creating a "Garden Railway" for it to run on.

The Fawley Hill Railway is a full-size (Standard Gauge) railway that runs for about 1½ miles through his estate and includes the steepest steam-worked adhesion standard gauge railway in the world with a ruling gradient of 1:13! Driving the train on this railway is not for the faint-hearted.

One of the things I like to do when driving the steam loco is to set myself little challenges to make things a bit more interesting, such as carrying out a hill start with a full load of passengers on the steepest part of the line, or trying to control the train so that it rolls to a halt at exactly the right position for the water tower without using the brakes.

Every year Sir William and Lady Judy McAlpine would host a rather lavish garden party for some of his many friends and acquaintances and on one particular occasion, one of the guests was Joe Brown whom we invited to have a ride on the footplate of the locomotive.

This invitation was gratefully accepted as Joe, before he became famous as a pop singer, was a locomotive fireman on the Eastern Region of British Railways based at Stratford Shed in East London. Naturally we were only too happy to grant his request and I ended up getting the gig to drive with Joe as my passenger.

As the train was gingerly making its way down the fearsome gradient, I couldn't help thinking that the famous bloke on the other side of the loco probably knew more about what I should be doing than I did!

At the far end of the line is a station building, that is just for show as passengers are not allowed to alight from the train during their ride, and the line continues for about a hundred yards beyond the platform before the buffer stop is reached. One of my little games is to continue beyond the platform to the very end of the line so that the passengers get to ride over the full extent of the line, and this was what I chose to do with Joe on the footplate. As the train rolled gently towards the buffer stops, Joe leaned out of the cab, looked across at me and said, in his best East End London accent, "Ere, you do realise there's a stop block down 'ere, don't ya mate!"



My repost was "It's OK, Joe, I'm just trying to see how close I can get to the buffers without hitting them!", which elicited the response from Joe of "Oo you vandal!"

I count myself very lucky to have been described as a vandal by such a famous pop star.

The picture shows me doing a hill start on the 1:13 gradient with my son Simon firing the locomotive in 2021 whilst being filmed by HRH Princess Anne on her mobile phone.

made automatically - you do not need to do anything. If you receive any text messages about Winter Fuel Payments, it's a scam.

#### **Met Engage**



Weekly, I receive emails from Met Engage, which is a new website for the local police and community to communicate with each other.

I had completed their questionnaire which asked the local community to tell the police what local residents concerns were, and I replied that mine were, "Dangerous Driving, Fraud, Scams and Theft"

On 25 November 2025 I received this email with details of a local police action:

"Officers conducted a traffic enforcement operation at Long Lane junction with Tudor Way. The location was selected based on community feedback and collision data analysis.

#### Purpose: Improve road safety

Target dangerous driving and traffic offences Ensure compliance with traffic laws

#### **Outcome:**

Two tickets issued for drivers using mobile phones while driving. Additional tickets issued for failure to wear a seat belt and driving without insurance.

The operation supports our ongoing commitment to road safety and community engagement."

#### Recipe of the month

**Puff Pastry Mincemeat Swirls** 



#### **Ingredients:**

1 pack of ready rolled puff pastry
1 jar of mincemeat (approx 400g)
30-50g chopped walnuts (optional)
I large orange
Handful of flaked almonds optional)
1 beaten egg
I long sugar for dusting

#### Method:


- 1. Preheat the oven to 200c (maybe a bit lower if a fan oven) or gas mark 6.
- 2. Unroll the pastry and spread the mincemeat over the pastry leaving a spare small edge at the far end.
- 3. If using walnuts, scatter them over, plus the zest of the orange.
- 4. Brush the beaten egg along the spare edge.
- 5. Roll the pastry up lengthwise like a swiss roll then cut into approx 20 even slices (the less messy way is to cover your baking sheet with baking paper then place the swirls on it cut side up).
- 6. Brush the edges of the swirls with the beaten egg and sprinkle on the flaked almonds.
- 7. Bake in the oven for approx 10-12 mins until golden then dust with the icing sugar and enjoy.

This is a great alternative to mince pies as so much easier but just as tasty.
