## A VIEW FROM THE VICARAGE

#### Dear All Saints



Kevin Hines had a miserable life, and jumped off the Gorden Gate Bruge to commusuicide, but regretted the moment he let go, praying "God I don't want to die, Help me". He hit the water at terminal velocity (75mph), breaking several vertebrae, which alone should have killed him, went under the water, and kept sinking. He was sure he was going to die. He then felt this shape in the water, thought it was a shark, tried to punch it, but it continued pushing him upwards. It was a sea-lion that kept him afloat until the coast-guard rescued him. Today he is a successful motivational speaker and encourages others who are struggling and contemplating suicide, to look in the mirror and say "*I am not how I feel right now. I can choose to live, to thrive, and embrace the gift called life.*"

If I am honest, I still don't understand prayer. Sometimes God answers miraculously and dramatically, like with Keven Hines, sometimes slowly, sometimes never. Sometimes the heavens seem like brass (Deut 28:23) and our most heart-felt prayers seem lost in the ether. But I'll keep praying as no prayer is wasted; God turns our scraps of failed prayers into something good. Even Jesus' prayer in Gethsemane to be delivered from agony and death was not answered, but it was converted into grace.

1<sup>st</sup> November is All Saints Day, and for over 1000 years the living church has remembered and celebrated the 'Church Triumphant' (those in now heaven) and the faithful departed. Hebrews 12:1 reminds us: "*Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles, and let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us*". So as the nights get darker, keep going, keep faithful, keep running the race, keep believing, keep praying, as although we cannot see or hear them, we are watched over by the Lord, his angels and the multitudes who have gone before us.

#### COFFEE, CAKE AND COMPANIONSHIP MORNINGS



We started up these coffee mornings back in the middle of May this year and decided on a Wednesday morning hoping that the Wednesday morning congregation would come along and support us in this new venture. This proved to be a wise move as they have been a very loyal band of visitors to these mornings.

We simply just offer a cup of coffee or tea plus a slice of homemade cake for **£3** but with the chance to meet and make old and new friends. It was not started to make money but just to get people together to have some company over a cuppa.

We have about 30 visitors each Wednesday, not always the same people, and several have come along and made new friends. Occasionally we have a table quiz and have now set up a swopping library so people can bring along any book they have finished with and swop it for a new one.

People have been very kind and generous donating cakes, tea, coffee, serviettes, cooking apples and recently a very generous donation of £100 from one of our congregation who is also a regular visitor for which we were very grateful. This is testing my baking skills as I try to find new recipes so that the cakes differ each week, we now have to make three each week to cope with demand.

We so far have raised the grand sum of £1230 and given our current situation this will go towards the church's boiler fund or help with heating the church.

So a huge thank you once again to all of those that support us but especially to Marion Robinson (my right hand woman and fellow baker) who turns up each Wednesday and without her help these mornings would not be possible. So if you are free any Wednesday morning between 10:45-12:45 why not pop along and see for yourself over a cuppa and a chat? We'll be more than pleased to see you !

#### Do you enjoy our hymns? Can you follow a melody? We need your help!

The choir usually meets for an hour-or-so 'in' Church on a Thursday evening. We practice the Psalm, and check on the hymns for the next few Sundays with the help of Frances, our very talented accompanist. NONE of the choir can sight-read,

so we rehearse any 'tricky bits'. Please do join us, and raise your voice in *Songs of Praise*!

#### TEA LOAF RECIPE

This is one of our popular cakes that we serve on a Wednesday morning. It can be eaten on its own or even better when buttered. I usually make one and once cold slice it up and then freeze it so just a slice at a time can be taken out to use, or if the family turn up then the whole thing, but it does freeze well.

Ingredients 300 ml of boiling water 3 or 4 tea bags 460 grams mixed dried fruit 140 grams light brown sugar ( can substitute for dark brown or caster ) 250 grams self raising flour 1 beaten egg 1 tsp mixed spice

#### Method

Put the tea bags into the boiling water and leave to brew for ten minutes, squeeze out the tea bags and remove and then add the mixed spice to the tea liquid. Put the dried fruit into a large bowl and pour over the tea/spice liquid,

stir and leave for **two hours** so that the fruit plumps up.

Then add the flour, sugar and the beaten egg to the steeping dried fruit and mix well, then put into a prepared loaf tin and bake at **150c** for approx. **an hour and 15 mins**. Check that the middle is done with a skewer or sharp knife - if it comes out clean then it is ready.

You can add nuts or chopped apple to the mix or drizzle with icing or honey once baked but however you do it I hope you enjoy it !
